Covenant Disciple Group

Covenant Discipleship Group tomorrow at Bolton UMC. The program starts at 6pm for a potluck meal (optional of course) followed by group discussion at 7pm. Come grow with us as we delve into our spiritual lives, and support one another in our faith! This group will meet from Oct 4 to Nov 22 6-8pm

We recognize that not everyone is able to drive in the evenings, or may have a conflicting schedule, so I am offering an alternative Covenant Discipleship Group on e Friday afternoons from 12:30-1:30pm. Please feel free to bring a bag lunch! The dates run from Oct 14 to Dec 30, with breaks on Nov 25 and Dec 23.

What is a Covenant Disciple Group? It is a small group spiritual formation cohort with the purpose of encouraging one another in spiritual growth as we journey on towards perfection, as well as supporting one another as we struggle with the many issues that we might encounter daily. Ideally a group will consist of 12 people who are committed to attending at least 9 of the 10 meetings. If you don't think you can make that commitment, I would ask that you wait for one of the future groups to participate in. Part of the covenant is regular participation. You will need to be able to count on one another. My participation in the group is largely exemplar and eventually supervisory. In other words, I will lead in the beginning, and a few of you will in turn lead the group. The format is simple. We gather for a potluck, then we gather afterwards for a devotional, a time of prayer, and then a time of personal sharing focused on the traditional Wesleyan question "How is it with your soul?" Of course, there are other commitments like daily prayer and scripture readings and personal reflection on Wesley's "22 questions" (he asks a lot of questions, doesn't he?) My is that 10 weeks of discipline together you will experience growth in journey with Christ, and have a deeper well of faith to draw upon. Please consider making this commitment. If the number exceeds 12, we will split into 2 or more groups as needed.

Mission Report Fall 2022

The Mission Committee has not met since Covid started. However, outreach work has continued in the form of food drives, the Crop Walk, Seasonal Sharing, and assistance with collection of school supplies.

NUMC has continually contributed needed food to the MACC Charities Community Food Pantry. Donated food is placed in the grocery cart and picked up and delivered once a week to the pantry. For those unable to shop, Marlene Camper will shop for them so that everyone can contribute to the food drives.

NUMC took part in the Town of Manchester "School Supplies Collection" in late August. The Town had requested gift cards to be dropped off at Social Services office. Donations were received from eight NUMC members.

The yearly Crop Walk was held on October 16, 2022. Seven members of the congregation walked the 2 miles with a large contingent of walkers from MACC and from other churches. The total monetary donation to the Crop Walk from NUMC members was \$475.

NUMC takes part in Seasonal Sharing sponsored by MACC Charities by filling 80 Blessings Bags to be given to adult families and single adults during the holiday season. In 2022, for the first time since Covid started, we will meet as a group in the Memorial Room to fill the bags. The Christmas season also has included "Books for the Village of Families and Children" with Linda VanDine taking the lead on this. The congregation generously donated new books and games to the nine children attending the Village program. The staff has been very appreciative and distributes the books at their Holiday party.
