Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Have you ever felt like we sometimes just move through life going from one task to the next, never giving much thought to the significance of a moment? I know when I get overworked, or my

schedule gets filled beyond my capacity to handle everything with the kind attention these things deserve, I kind of go on autopilot. A few of the things I am trying to do during lent is to 1) be kinder to myself. I do that by scheduling my patient load less rigorously (when possible) on three afternoons a week so I can go to the gym to exercise. 2) I am trying to eat healthier during lent. That means more fruits and vegetables and less junk food. And the third thing is I am seeking out holy moments. Holy moments can be found in unexpected places and at unexpected times. Holy moments are when you open yourself up to God, making yourself completely available to the moving of the Spirit and set aside self interest and preference. That's not an easy thing to do, and for me, it is a work in progress. I know myself, I am prone to overschedule and over function. I am also prideful and like having my way. So, when God's way interferes or contradicts my way, it sometimes leads me to being withdrawn from my spiritual life.

During the remainder of the Lenten season, and hopefully beyond, I hope you will join me in seeking holy moments. Work through the uncomfortable and inconvenient, and I know that on the other side, you will find spiritual growth and a growing sense of peace.


Counters Needed




